



Occasions Filled with Grace and Blessings

– CamUp



Coinciding with the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary on May 31, 2019, the Order of the Ministers of the Infirm (Camillians-Philippine Province) gathered together in the Holy Eucharist at Sts. Camillus de Lellis and Lorenzo de Ruiz Chapel as they celebrated four important events.

Fr. Jose P. Eloja, Provincial Superior, administered the Admission to the Novitiate of Vianney Chou Ka Wa, a Chinese-Macau national. Fr. Anthony Ongcal, the assistant Novice Master, assisted him in putting on the cassock. He then knelt before the Provincial as he said the Prayer of Commitment.

Fr. Ivo Anselmi, the Novice Master, presented the candidates for the First Profession of Vows: Novices Paul Austin Añana Echavez, Ruel Tesoro Fernandez, Vengie Atriz Ibañez and Fr. Dong Sheng Ping. The Father Provincial asked them questions and they answered in unison. Each then took turn and knelt before the Father Provincial and read the formula of profession. A big Red Cross was pinned on their cassocks and a crucifix was given to each newly professed.

Fr. Angel Crisostomo, Director of Scholastics, presented Scholastics Benjie Mortillero Ang, Dennis Ebol Morales and Yeongmin Andrew Kang for the Renewal of Vows. In front of Fr. Eloja, they recited the formula of profession.

Last but not the least was the Solemn Profession of Vows of Scholastic Almar Samaniego Roman. As the Litany of the Saints was sung, he laid prostrate on the floor. He then knelt before the Father Provincial and recited

We feel nervous about things that are not going as we hoped. We need to get used to it because that feeling will come up many times in our lives. But we must remember that that's not where our joy falls because joy does not depend on things going well. Joy depends on keeping God in our community, on remembering we are His servants. God works His blessings in the most ordinary of circumstances and that grace comes from living in the presence of God within our community.

"Grace is a participation in the life of God. It introduces us into the intimacy of Trinitarian life..." (CCC 1996). "In such a way, grace conveys a special power to deal with the routine trials of life. We grow and are able to persevere because we meet trials not so much with our own power, but rather are participating in the source of eternal life. This statement also has a great deal to teach us about God's blessing as well. God's blessing is not so much about a subjective experience of good circumstances. Rather, it is an experience of intimacy." (Sara and Justin Kraft, *How We Found God's Blessings and Grace in the Most Unexpected Places*, blog post). When community life is approached with a sense of service to God, one finds that intimacy can be experienced both in living the religious vows and in serving the sick even at the risk of one's life.

In the past months of May and June, we had in our Province joyful occasions filled with grace and blessings as we keep God in our different communities and remembering that we are His servants. We had the admission to the novitiate, the first profession of vows, the renewal of vows, the solemn profession of vows, the ordination to the diaconate, the blessings of new structures, the anniversary celebrations of our institutions, etc. as you can see in this issue of the Camillian Update.

Each day we have the option to choose to be a better person. Let us always ask for God's grace to help us get through each day and to recognize His blessings.

LCF-Calbayog City Chapter

The Friends of the Sick of the Lay Camillian Family Calbayog Chapter (FOTS LCF-Calbayog) was established in the year 1997 at the St. Camillus Hospital of Calbayog City. Fr. Salvador Cariño (Fr. Buddy), the hospital chaplain at that time, visited our parish, St. Vincent Ferrer Parish after he heard from our assistant priest, Fr. Melvin Ojeda that we have a small group serving the sick. Our group of five people (Fr. Melvin, Angelito Pelotos, Jose Arropo, Marvin Muñoz and I) regularly visit the sick to talk to them. We sometimes give them a bath and cook food for them especially the elderly who have no children or family member to take care of them. We assist and care also for those who are dying. Fr. Melvin also taught us to always include them in our prayers.

Fr. Buddy was inspired because he found people with the same charism of caring for the sick just like the Camillians. He asked me if I was willing to help him organize a group called Friends of the Sick (FOTS) and I immediately agreed to his proposal. Despite being a single mom and

having been entrusted with a big responsibility, I took the challenge as this mission of serving the sick is important for me. So, I called the attention of the youth in our parish and about 30 people willingly joined the group. We went to visit the sick in four barangays (Bante, Malajog, Danao 1, and San Joaquin). Others were inspired in what we do and after some time, our group membership doubled to 60 and we were able to cover four more barangays in our city (Oquendo, Trinidad, Calbayog City proper and Sta. Margarita). We also organized many activities during the time of Fr. Buddy as our spiritual adviser.

Over the years the Camillian priest assignment to the parish also changed. Some members also became busy including me because of personal reasons. (However, I continue to serve the sick in my own way including participating in the World Day of the Sick celebration in our parish every February 11).

The group continues to serve the sick in our community. We have health care activities. We also organize gath-

John Jay Magpusao, our spiritual adviser during our renewal last 2015. We also thank the LCF National Spiritual Adviser, Fr. Renato Maliwat. We are very fortunate since he is assigned here in Calbayog. Despite some difficulties, he patiently guides us always. Lastly, we extend our gratitude to Fr. the formula of perpetual profession of vows. As a gesture of acceptance by the Camillian Community, the newly perpetually professed was approached and embraced by the Perpetually Professed Camillians who were present during the Mass.

The celebration continued the next day, June 1, 2019 as it was the Ordination to the Sacred Order of Deacons of Br. Almar S. Roman and Br. Marcelino S. Digal. The ordaining prelate was Most Rev. Nolly C. Bucu, DD, Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Antipolo.

New Deacons

Rev. Almar S. Roman was born on June 21, 1990 in Bataan to Jose Alen Roman and Marilet Samaniego. He finished his elementary education at Hermosa Elementary School (1997–2003) and secondary education at Saint Peter of Verona Academy (2003–2007) in Hermosa, Bataan.

He entered the Immaculate Conception Major Seminary in Tabe, Guiguinto, Bulacan and took Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy (2007–2011). He transferred to Saint Camillus College Seminary in Marikina City and finished his AB Philosophy course (2011–2013).

After his Philosophical Studies, he underwent the Integration Formation or the Postulancy Program at Saint Camillus Formation Center in Antipolo, Rizal (Jan–May 2013) and the Novitiate Formation in Baguio City (June 2013–May 2014). He made his First Profession on May 31, 2014. He continued his Scholasticate Formation at Casa d' Onofrio Community in Quezon City and finished his General Theology Program and Masters in Theology



Major in Pastoral Ministry at the CICM Maryhill School of Theology (2014–2018). He spent his Pastoral Year Formation at Saint Camillus College Seminary (May 2018–June 2019).

Rev. Marcelino S. Digal was born in Lagtangan, Sevilla, Bohol to Roque Samon Digal and Benita Dano Sayud (both deceased). He is the 5th among six siblings.

He completed his elementary and high school education in Sevilla, Bohol, while he finished his AB Philosophy and Bachelor of Science in Nursing courses in Metro Manila. He recently completed the General Theology Program at CICM-Maryhill School of Theology.

He is fondly called "Brother Mars" because he is a Camillian solemn professed brother; so far, he is the only Filipino who had chosen to solemnly profess the Camillian religious vows.

After his solemn profession in 2000 during the celebration of the 25th year of Camillian presence in the Philippines, he was assigned for two years as a co-journeyer of the Indonesian seminarians at St. Camillus Asian Formation Center in Marikina. Then he was sent to study Medicine in Baguio City and stayed at St. Camillus Novitiate.

In 2003 he was assigned to St. Camillus Hospital-Mati in Davao Oriental. For five years he was able to practice his profession as a registered nurse in various positions and responsibilities at the hospital. Unfortunately, in November 2008 he left the Order.

After eight years of being away from the Order, he came back to the fold of St. Camillus in 2016 with new aspiration to serve the Lord and His church as an ordained

INDONESIA: The Heart Relic of St. Camillus de Lellis in Indonesia

On the occasion of the ten-year anniversary of the Camillian Delegation (2009–2019), the heart relic of St. Camillus was brought to Indonesia to mark the historical and important event of the mission. After two long months spent in the Philippines (February and March), the heart relic of St. Camillus arrived in Jakarta on April 2, 2019 and remained in the country until April 30, 2019. Three dioceses were visited, namely: Ruteng, Maumere and Jakarta.

On April 4, 2019 the relic was brought to the Diocese of Ruteng, where the Camillians have a formation house with 20 aspirants. In the 12 days spent there, the relic reached several parishes and hospitals. Many people were attracted and touched by the healing power of the Patron Saint of the Sick.

On April 13 the relic was transferred by plane to the diocese of Maumere where the bigger Camillian community is located with 40 seminarians in Philosophy, 6 novices and 15 religious.

The people of Maumere were really excited to see for the first time the loving heart of the Patron of the Sick,

Health Care Personnel and Hospitals. On its arrival the relic was welcomed by hundreds of people at the airport. Then, a 10-km motorcade was organized to accompany it to the Camillian Seminary in Nita where it was welcomed by our seminarians, people, and children with traditional local dances.

The presence of the relic in the Diocese of Maumere was a blessing especially for the sick who prayed a lot in front of it with great devotion. The places visited were the Cathedral of Maumere, St. Elisabeth Hospital of Lela, St. Gabriel Hospital of Kewapante, General Hospital of Maumere and two parishes. Hundreds of people were really attracted and touched upon hearing the story of the life of St. Camillus.

But the most touching moments of the visit were in the hospitals when the heart relic passed in front of the bed of each patient. Tears of joy were falling down from the eyes of many patients. They seemed to receive from our Saint new trust and hope in life.

The pilgrimage of the relic in Maumere ended on Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019, at 5:00pm with a concelebrated thanksgiving Holy Mass presided over by the





bishop of the diocese, Msgr. Edwaldus Sedu, in the chapel of our seminary. The chapel was really fully packed with hundreds of people. In his message the bishop said: "On behalf of the faithful of the Diocese of Maumere, I would like to say many thanks to the Camillians for bringing the relic of the heart of St. Camillus in our diocese. May the presence of this relic inspire many more people in our diocese."

On April 22, 2019 the relic was brought to Jakarta where it remained for more than a week visiting two big Catholic hospitals and two parishes. Impressive also was the participation of the people who went to honor and venerate the precious heart of St. Camillus.

In almost one month of presence of the relic in Indonesia, touching were also the comments of some doctors and nurses who learned for the first time about the life and the work of charity of St. Camillus. "Our encounter with the life of St. Camillus," they said, "made us feel in love with the charism and spirituality of the saint who saw the presence of Jesus in the sick. Now, we understand better that our medical profession can become a 'mission' every time we are caring for the sick with his vision." They concluded, "We hope that this precious relic can come back again and soon to Indonesia to inspire us more."

It is therefore important that healthcare professionals have adequate safeguards in their work, receive proper recognition for the tasks they perform, and can use the right tools to be always motivated and trained."

INCREASING AWARENESS ON HEALTH AND HUMAN RIGHTS



St. Camillus saw the vulnerability of the patients thought as the most unwanted in society. Often, this led to depression and lonely deaths of the patients. It was then that Camillus' heart took care of the vulnerable letting

them feel that they are not forgotten and aiming to bring back their dignity from being outcasts.

For more than one year now, the Home of Hope of St. Camillus caring for those with high risk behavior increased its efforts to uphold health and human rights issues.

Series of outreaches have been done and are scheduled in different barangays of Cebu City and nearby urban areas in Metro Cebu to promulgate health (testing, referral to treatment centers, treatment adherence, case management, psychospiritual support and others) and human rights (legal literacy and health rights).

More than 230 clients since May 2019 have been served.
