



The First Fruit of Camillian Mission in Indonesia

Priestly Ordination of Fr. Mensianus Aman

After 10 years, the Camillian marked another milestone in its presence in Indonesia last November 17, 2019. It was the ordination of Fr. Mensianus Aman, MI, who was among the first batch of Camillian seminarians formed in Indonesia since 2009. He finished most of his Camillian formation in Indonesia, except for his novitiate and pastoral year in the Philippines. Fr. Mensa, who hails from Lembor, Mangarai, diocese of Ruteng, is the first fruit of Camillian mission in the country. With his ordination, the number of Indonesian Camillian priests increases to 5.

He was ordained with seven other deacons from the Carmelites (O.Carm) at the Holy Cross parish church, Maulo'o, about 43 km from the city of Maumere. About 3,000 parishioners, religious men and

“Not Your Work, But Mine”

Fr. Almar Roman's Ordination

All roads led to Hermosa, Bataan, the hometown of Rev. Almar, last November 23, 2019. At exactly 9 o'clock in the morning, the bells of St. Peter the Martyr of Verona Parish Church tolled, signifying the start of the celebration of the Holy Eucharist with the rite of the Holy Orders. His Excellency Most Rev. Ruperto C. Santos, DD, Bishop of the Diocese of Balanga, was the main presider with Camillian and diocesan priests as concelebrants.

Witnessed by the deacon's family, relatives, former classmates, friends, and parishioners, the solemn celebration was complemented by the beautiful music of St. Peter the Martyr of Verona Grand Choir.

Fr. Jojo Eloja, the provincial superior, then presented the candidate Rev. Almar to the presiding bishop, who in turn approved his candidacy to the priesthood.

In his homily, Bishop Santos said that Rev. Almar is the town of Her-

"And here is a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger" (Lk 2:12). See the God who gave up all heavenly privileges and come to the world, subject to all kinds of insults, and these are all for the love of us. This is the sign that we need to remember in our life. The sign which will help people go in the right direction and help us to praise the Lord even in difficult moments. This is the sign that will make us strong and will help us find God's light.

May we walk in the light of the Lord as we begin the new year 2020!

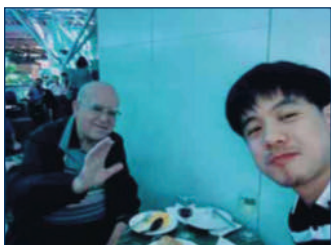

women, and the family/relatives of the newly ordained priests attended the ordination.

In his homily, the ordaining prelate Bishop Ewaldus Sedu of the diocese of Maumere reminded the newly ordained priests about the essence of their vocation. "The priests are called to imitate Christ in holiness. They are called to live out the holiness in prayer and ministry." Furthermore, he mentioned three important aspects in living a priestly life. "First, the sacrament of Holy Order is a gift which requires faithfulness of those who receive it. Second, being a priest is not only becoming a good preacher, but also a good listener. Third, living out the priestly life must pay attention to community living or living in communion with fellow clergy, ordinary and the faithful."

After the ordination, the thanksgiving celebration for Fr. Mensa was held in the Seminari St. Kamilus, Nita-Maumere, Flores. Present during the celebration were Fr. Jojo Eloja, MI, provincial superior of the Philippine Province; representatives of the Camillian confreres from the Philippines, Taiwan and Australia; friends and benefactors of the seminary; collaborators in the ministry; and the family members of Fr. Mensa.

In his message, Fr. Jojo thanked the parents of Fr. Mensa for giving their son to the Church and to the Camillians. He also congratulated the Camillian confreres and the delegation of Indonesia for the formation program carried out in the country, and the good number of vocations in the seminary. He hopes that one day, the Indonesian Camillian religious will be missionaries in other parts of the world to preach the Gospel and heal the sick.

The family, represented by Fr. Sebastian, SVD, the eldest brother of Fr. Mensa, thanked the Camillians for taking care of the vocation of their family member. Fr. Se-



bastian came back from his mission in Chile to attend the ordination of his youngest brother.

Fr. Suparman Andi, MI, rector of the St. Camillus Seminary and representing the Camillian delegation of Indonesia, thanked Fr. Mensa for his commitment to join the Camillians and welcomed him into the group of Camillian Indonesian delegation as a priest. He also extended the greetings of Fr. Luigi Galvani, MI, the delegation superior who was still in Italy and was unable to join this historical occasion due to health reasons, but was united with him and the community in prayers.

The thanksgiving Mass in his village was held on November 21, 2019. The community was represented by the aspirants, pre-novices, novices, and the scholastics, and priests. The villagers and parishioners welcomed him joyfully with traditional music and dances with the Eucharistic celebration in traditional nuance.

mosa's gift to the Order of the Ministers of the Infirm (Camillians). And by God's grace, he is the Camillians' gift to the Mother Church. He said that after all the festivities, the real work starts. The red cross emblazoned in the Camillian vestment symbolizes the blood of Christ. It should not only be embedded in the vestment, but also in the heart as well. The red cross has two characteristics: it is a sign of charity and a symbol of service.

Just like Jesus who carried his cross and was even crucified on the cross to fulfill God's love, he gently reminded Rev. Almar to embrace his cross and realize his fourth vow, "to serve the sick even at the risk of his own life."

"There will be times of desolation, loneliness, hard work, temptation and even doubts as you go along in performing your role as priest, but do not be afraid. This work is not yours, but God's."

The Rite of the Holy Orders continued with the recitation of the Litany of the Saints while the candidate lay

prostrate on the floor. The bishop then laid his hands upon his head and the Camillian priests, one by one, also laid their hands on him. The bishop then said the Prayer of Ordination.

Then his mother and aunt brought him the priestly vestments and wore on him, assisted by Fr. Ruben Mandin, his former Novice Master.

This was followed by the Anointing of Hands and again, the Camillian priests, one by one embraced him, welcoming him as one of their confreres.

Fr. Almar gave his message of thanks to all the people, who in one way or another, supported, molded and inspired him to fulfill this cherished moment. Reception followed at the adjacent St. Peter of Verona Academy.

At 6:00pm, Fr. Almar celebrated his first Thanksgiving mass with Fr. Raymond Gutang as the homilist. Joining him were Fr. Antonio Quintos, Jr. (parish priest of St. Peter the Martyr of Verona), Fr. Anthony Sibug (asst. parish priest) and other Camillian priests. – *CamUp*
