Venerable NICOLA D'ONOFRIO


(Villamagna, 24 march 1943 - Rome, 12 june 1964)

THE VOCATION

At an early age, Nicholas providentially met a Camillian student and was fascinated by his "Red cross" that distinguishes his dress. This meeting does not generate in him the enthusiasm of the moment but the desire of God who calls him to follow among the Ministers of the Sick. His parents, of granite faith, initially they are not compliant with him and only after several insistences of the son they indulge his desire to enter the seminary.

The Camillians' charism and lifestyle excited him to the point that he notes these reflections: "Our vocation is really great. We are entrusted with the poor sick, the pupils of God. What a beauty it must be to arrive in the evening tired of having served the sick (...) A Father used to tell me that for him the best rest was precisely conversation with the sick. It must be really true."

He not only has the desire to become a Camillian but above all that of becoming a saint in this path of life; here is his program of life: "What an easy method to reach God! Almost all the saints were poor and yet, what happiness! So why don't I also do like the saints? "



THE ILLNESS

At the age of 19, the first symptoms of the tumor appear. He does not lose the joy of living, his own smile and his faith - even if tried - never fails. "I am very happy to be able to suffer a little bit now that I'm young, because these are the best years to offer (something) to Lord ".

Nicola is so strong and lucid in his illness that he is the one who encourages others. To his parents he writes: "Dear parents, pray you too so that the Lord will make me regain strength, so I can to become a Priest and still work a lot for souls. But if the good Lord wanted something different from me and you, blessed be the Lord because He knows what He does and what is best for us".

THE MESSAGE

Nicola's life may appear to be the linear path of a young man called and cut short by disease. In reality, his life goes far beyond and leaves a very clear message to those who approach to him. First of all, it offers a clear example of life lived to the full in following Jesus. To this adds her spiritual link with the saint of Lisieux: "Saint Therese is the saint I like best because she looks a lot like me. She too fell ill when she was just over twenty, she suffered a lot and a twenty-four years he died."

At the school of Saint Teresina, Nicola lived the little way: abandoning himself blindly to God as a child and doing the little things of ordinary life with great love.

The twenty-one years of Nicola's life are all condensed in these words: Jesus I want to love you,

I want to make you love!
